

COST Action Precision-BTC Network CA22125

MENTORSHIP PROGRAM 2025-2026

Objectives

European Cholangiocarcinoma Network (ENS-CCA), under the Precision-BTC Network COST Action CA22125, and the International Cholangiocarcinoma Research Network (ICRN) are pleased to announce a collaborative mentorship initiative.

The program aims to support and guide junior researchers in their career paths and scientific development by pairing them with experienced mentors from the ICRN and Precision-BTC networks.

While many institutions already have established mentorship practices, this joint program offers a unique opportunity for junior researchers to receive guidance from international, independent, and highly experienced physician-scientists, mentors who share a passion for biliary tract cancer research.

We are pleased to launch the following virtual mentoring program for 2025-2026 with the following characteristics:

- > Duration: 6-month virtual mentoring activity
- > Focus: Career development and professional choices; biliary tract cancer research
- > Commitment: Mentors and mentees are expected to participate in a 1-hour virtual meeting every 30-45 days
- > Progress Reporting: A mid-term report must be submitted to the Program Administrator
- > Opportunities: Mentees may apply for the <u>COST Short-Term Scientific Mission</u> to visit their mentor's institution, provided they meet the eligibility criteria
- > Conference Participation: Mentees can submit an abstract to present their scientific work, if applicable, at the <u>Precision-BTC Network Annual Conference</u> and the Cholangiocarcinoma Foundation Annual Conference poster session.

Eligibility Criteria for Mentees

- > Educational Background: Applicants must be early-stage researchers with either a Medical Degree (MD) or a Ph.D. obtained within the last 10 years (i.e., after January 1, 2015). For those holding both degrees, only the date of the first degree will be considered.
- > Language: Fluent in written and spoken English.
- > Research Focus: Candidates should have demonstrated strong interest in cholangiocarcinoma, having at least one published paper or abstract published on the topic.

Application Process for Mentees

Junior investigators interested in applying for the Mentorship Programs are invited to <u>submit the application form</u> and ensure the following documents are included:

- 1. Curriculum Vitae
- 2. Motivation Letter: Clearly specify why you are interested in applying, objectives, and anticipated outcomes by the conclusion of the program.
- 3. Letter of Recommendation: A letter from institute/head of department endorsing the application.
- 4. Published Work: A paper or abstract published on cholangiocarcinoma

Selection Process and Matching

- > Application submissions open: October 1, 2025
- > Applications deadline: November 1, 2025
- > Selection and matching: Program Directors and the Board of Mentors will select up to 15 Mentees and match them with Mentors by November 30, 2025.
- > Notification of matches: By December 8, 2025

Start of the program and Follow-up

- > Matched Mentors and Mentees must arrange the first call by December 30, 2025.
- > By the end of the program, a final program evaluation form will be sent to Mentees and Mentors to evaluate the program's effectiveness and keep it up-to-date and useful.
- > Mentees and their Mentors must submit their evaluation within a maximum of 30-days from the end of the program.
